

APPROVED at the RISEBA Senate meeting on 13.10.2021. Minutes No. 21/1.1-7/8

Honorary Professorship Regulations of RISEBA

- 1. The title of honorary professor is awarded for:
- 1.1. for special merits in science and/or development of higher education;
- 1.2. for significant achievements in business management;
- 1.3. for noteworthy contributions to the development of RISEBA.
- 2. The title of honorary professor cannot be awarded
- 2.1. at the time of assignment to ministers performing their duties;
- 2.2. Members of parliament;
- 2.3. Leaders of political parties;
- 2.4. Head of state (President);
- 2.5. to persons from other countries who are in similar positions.
- 3. Requirements for applicants:

At least a master's degree or equivalent.

- 4. Awarding Process and Procedure:
- 4.1. The RISEBA Honorary Professor title is awarded by the Senate based on the results of a secret ballot.
- 4.2. Candidates for the Honorary Professorship can be nominated by the Senate and/or the rector.
- 4.3. The nominator of the candidate for the title of honorary professor shall submit it to the chairman of the Senate:
- 4.3.1. Candidate's CV for the honorary professorship;
- 4.3.2. Documents certifying the merits and contribution to the development of RISEBA mentioned in Clause 1 of these Regulations;
- 4.4. The Chair of the Senate sends all the documents of the candidate for the title of Honorary Professor to the members of the Senate at least 5 working days before the Senate session on awarding the title of Honorary Professor.

- 4.5. At the Senate meeting, the nominator of the candidate for the title of Honorary Professor presents the members of the Senate with the candidate's CV and contributions and merits.
- 4.6 Secret voting for awarding the title of Honorary Professor to the nominated candidate is organized and the results are compiled in accordance with the rules of the Senate.
- 4.7. The recipient of the title of Honorary Professor is presented with a golden badge, mantle of honorary professor and diploma of honorary professor.
- 4.8. The award ceremony takes place during the annual RISEBA staff meeting or another formal event.
- 4.9. The Honorary Professorship diploma is presented by the RISEBA rector or Chair of the Senate.
- 4.10. After the presentation of the honorary professor's diploma, a 15-20-minute speech by the honorary professor follows.
- 4.11. Information about the award is published on the RISEBA website.
- 5. Honorary Professorship Diploma:
- 5.1. RISEBA emblem and logo;
- 5.2. University name RISEBA University of Business, Arts, and Technology;
- 5.3. Title "Honoris Causa";
- 5.4. Recipient's name and surname;
- 5.5. Date of honorary professorship award;
- 5.6. Signatures of the RISEBA rector and Chair of the Senate.
- 6. Honorary Professors badge:
- 6.1. Engraved with the recipient's name and surname;
- 6.2. Honorary Professors badge serial number;
- 7. Rights of the Honorary Professor:
- 7.1. Use the title in internal and external communication, media, business cards, etc.
- 7.2. Attend all RISEBA-organized events free of charge;
- 7.3. Use the RISEBA library, subscribed databases, RISEBA health insurance and other privileges intended for RISEBA employees.
